
We write to you today regarding Bishop Laszlo Tokes, whose heroism and leadership in helping to end Nicolae Ceausescu's dictatorship during the 1989 Revolution are undeniable. Bishop Tokes championed the freedom of all Romanian citizens through his ministry in Timisoara — frequently reaching across ethnic and religious boundaries to help liberate Romania from the burden of Communism. He was given the Order of the Star of Romania in 2009 in recognition of his service to the country.

We were therefore surprised and deeply disappointed to learn that the ethics committee of the Order of the Star of Romania revoked its award to Reverend Tokes. The revocation was made on alleged grounds of "anti-constitutional" acts by Reverend Tokes, when in fact it is our understanding that he was exercising his constitutional rights, including his right to free speech, by peacefully speaking up on behalf of a minority population within Romania.

The development with regard to Bishop Tokes is troubling on a number of levels, not the least of which is that seems to indicate a closing of democratic space in Romania.


Mr. President, we urge you to do everything within your power to request that the ethics committee rescind its unjust action against Reverend Tokes.
